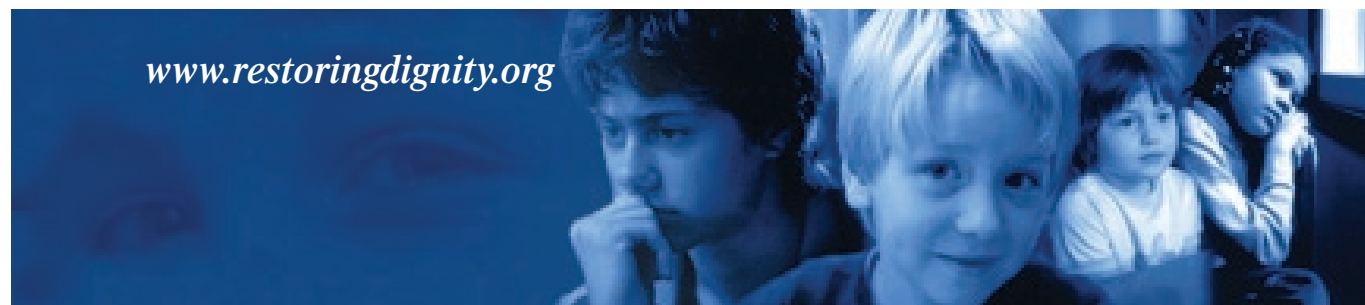

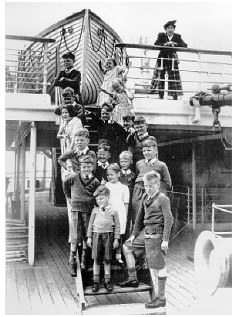

Most were orphans or from families of "lower social orders" and were typically employed as either domestics or farm labourers.
